Dr. David H. Perrin, alumnus of Indiana State University (1977 MA in Physical Education and specialization in Athletic Training) is the 2022 Dr. Mildred Lemen Distinguished Speaker at Indiana State University College of Health and Human Services. He will present a lecture and take questions on ***Promoting Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion in the Health Professions***, on October 19, 2022 from 12-1pm in CHHS, C-19.

Dr. Perrin is the former Dean of the College of Health and Professor of Physical Therapy and Athletic Training at the University of Utah, and previously at the University of Pittsburgh, Castleton State College, and University of Virginia, and went on to be Dean of the School of Health and Human Performance and later Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Dr. Perrin's scholarly work focuses on injury prevention and treatment and he is the author of numerous peer-reviewed publications, abstracts, book chapters, and books including *Isokinetic Exercise and Assessment*, and *Athletic Taping and Bracing*. He is editor of *The Injured Athlete*, and coauthor of *Examination of Musculoskeletal Injuries*, and *Research Methods in Athletic Training*. He also served as series editor of the 5-textbook *Athletic Training Education Series*, was editor-in-chief of the *Journal of Athletic Training* and founding editor of the *Journal of Sport Rehabilitation*.

Dr. Perrin is the recipient of numerous honors including Fellow of the American College of Sports

Medicine, Fellow of the National Academy of Kinesiology, and Fellow of the National Athletic Trainers' Association. Friends and former students have established the David H. Perrin Athletic Training and Sports Medicine Scholarship in the Curry School of Education Foundation at University of Virginia, the NATA Research and Education Foundation's Outstanding Dissertation Award and the Ethnic Diversity Advisory Committee scholarship is given in his honor.

Dr. Mildred Lemen established the speaker series with the intent of highlighting the interdisciplinary nature of the College of Health and Human Services and we are grateful for her continued support.
