The United States Supreme Court 2022-2023: Legal Questions and Controversy

Could this term of the US Supreme Court be more dramatic than last year? It is hard to imagine but with a docket from race-conscious admissions policies at Harvard College to "transformative" visual arts in the marketplace, it certainly will be contentious. Add to these the prospect of highly-charged arguments over "originalism" and the addition of the first Black woman justice and we can expect to see the Court in the spotlight again as we come close to the end of the 2022-2023 term when the most potentially inflammatory decisions will be announced.

The class will start with a review of the federal court system and the role the Constitution gave to the highest judicial body posing the perennial question: How did the Supreme Court garner so much power when its origin story is so modest? Armed with historical context, we will proceed to probe the contributions of landmark cases over the Court's 300 plus years of decision-making before launching into a dissection of select disputes from the 60 or so cases the Justices will deliberate this term. A combination of lecture, discussion and film clips will accompany our journey into the world of the Judicial Branch of the United States. Materials will include the US Constitution, Court decisions and handouts on the structure of the federal court system, historical chronologies of Court decisions and a glossary of legal terms.

Suffering Sobriety: Addiction and Recovery in Japan

Japan is widely permissive of alcohol consumption and drunkenness. Simultaneously, narcotic use is met with severe stigma and harsh punishments. Together these opposing views create a society that is antagonistic in its perception and treatment of those trying to stop using and live recovery. The result is a place where self-identified addicts struggle to make their lives fit the dictates of recovery programs imported outside Japan while fearful of being labeled and treated as a stigmatized figure. Such a situation is also the opposite of the message put forward by recovery groups, leaving Japan's addicts in an impossible situation as they work to manage their condition in a society that does not recognize it validity.

City Directories offer much information of the occupation, residence and family on a particular street in a particular city. Print financing was supported by local advertisers and the advertising is, in itself, a good source for research in family history and social and historical research.



The Jewish Ghetto of Venice from 1516 to 1797 and Beyond A Study in Marginalization and Liberation

On March 29, 1516, the Doge of the Venetian Senate proclaimed the establishment of a section of Venice, an island in the northcentral part of the collection of islands which comprised the Republic, that would house and contain the almost 1,000 Jews who inhabited the territory. The place chosen for this segregated population was the site of an old, unused foundry, "geto," in Venetian Italian, and most likely the origin of the word which was also spelled getto or ghetto. Iron gates at the openings to the canals that distinguish Venice were locked at night and opened in the morning by guards to ensure that the inhabitants would not leave the area. For next 281 years, the ghetto functioned as a marginalized city within a city. In the aftermath of the French Revolution, the army of Napoleon marched across northern Italy liberating the ghettos in the name of the slogans of the Revolution, Liberty, Equality, Fraternity.

This class will explore the reasons for the institution of the ghetto, the relations of the inhabitants to each other and to the Venetians and its broader cultural significance. The disturbing and growing manifestation of Anti-Semitism will be central to the story. The class will also focus on the concept and reality of the isolation of any population by a dominant power structure, whether Venice, Soweto or Harlem. Materials for the course will include lecture outlines, handouts of readings, video clips and excerpts from a play about the Ghetto.




The Dining with Diabetes program can help!





Some probate records for various states are now online; however, a trip to a county court house to research family probate records might just reveal more clues than you expected. Probate records include wills, estate inventories, sales, petitions, bonds, receipts and guardianships among other items.

Past probate records are mirrors of the place and time that an ancestor lived. One can find family members, relationships, friends and exclusions. The land, the possessions and sales of such provide a clue to the status of an ancestor's monetary worth at the time.

These are basic clues, but there are so many more pieces of information that gives the family researcher a perspective of an ancestor's life and personality.



The cardiac rehab program at Horizon Health is specifically designed to meet the individual needs of each patient recovering from a variety of cardiac conditions occurring in the last 12 months. 

Two programs at Horizon Health help individuals with Parkinson's disease improve their quality of life--LSVT Big & Loud. These programs are designed to improve speech and body movement, which the disease primarily affects. The programs are led by certified licensed therapists in Horizon Health's Rehabilitation Services Department.



This one-on-one physical therapy program focuses on improving body movements. This involves refining smaller movements, such as self-care, to larger movements like getting up from a sofa or maintaining balance while walking. The program's guiding principle is "Think BIG!" as it reteaches patients how normal movement should feel.

"LSVT LOUD" Program

This program is considered the "gold standard" of speech treatment for people with Parkinson's disease. The one-on-one sessions improve communication by helping the patient speak with a voice and volume that is easy for others to hear and understand.

Exercises help strengthen the voice box (larynx), speech system, and "reset" the patient's perception of how loud he or she is speaking. As a result, patients can experience better articulation, changes in swallowing, improved facial expressions while talking, and even speech-related brain changes.
